ENTERING A SECOND YEAR OF COVID-19

Adapt and overcome! That's been our mantra for FY21 at Youth Services of Tulsa. As we navigated the ever-changing conditions of the COVID pandemic while maintaining client and staff safety, YST spent the last year adapting our services to meet the needs of youth and their families.

In pivoting to virtual with some of our services, we learned that while many of our youth benefited from this approach, others lacked access to technology and/or needed that face-to-face interaction. Moving forward we plan to incorporate both approaches.

We learned our homeless youth were at greatest risk for contracting and spreading the virus, so we worked with community partners to facilitate vaccination opportunities and increased housing options.

We encountered challenges in delivering our evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention curriculum with closed school campuses and remote learning, so we developed a virtual approach to teaching this much needed medically accurate information to continue the trend of reducing teen pregnancy rates in Tulsa County.

These are just a couple of examples of how YST adapted to overcome the challenges of the past year.

Thanks to staff, Board, donors, and community stakeholders for your continued support. Working together, YST will remain on the front line serving Tulsa-area Youth
